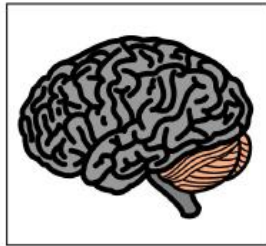


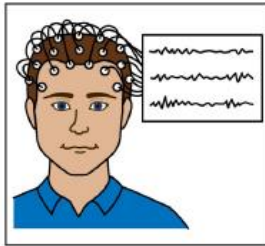
GETTING AN EEG

An EEG looks at my brain.



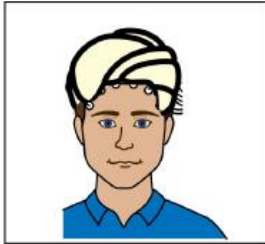
They will put stickers on my head. There are wires attached to the stickers.



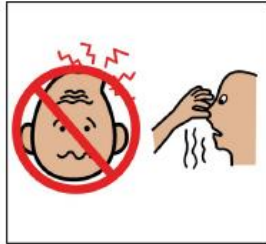
The wires attach to a computer.

The EEG will not hurt. It might smell funny in the room when I get an EEG.



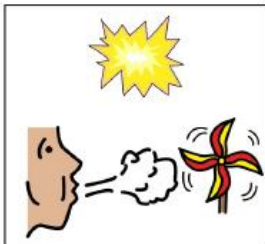
If I feel nervous, I can ask for a break.



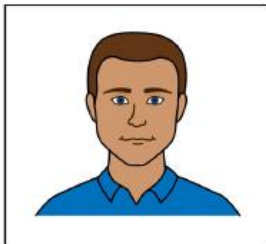
I will not touch the wires on my head.
